This 32-hour course is designed to meet the POST Perishable Skills requirements for Arrest & Control, Firearms, Strategic Communications, Driving, Racial Profiling, CPR/First Aid/AED Refresher, and the new Mandate by the State of California Use of Force. Designed to meet Title 22 and P.C. 1318 (a) standards. These **4 days** when taken all together satisfy the POST 2-year CPT training requirement and several legislative mandates.
